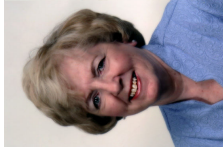

SPEAKERS



Most Reverend Gerald M. Barbarito was installed as the fifth Bishop of the Diocese of Palm Beach on August 28, 2003. Prior to this, he had served as the 12th Bishop of the Diocese of Ogdensburg since 2000 and as Auxiliary Bishop of Brooklyn since 1994. Bishop Barbarito has served on the College of Consultors, the Priests' Personnel Board, the Presbyteral Council and as an appellate judge at the diocesan tribunal. He has also served as consultant to the Canonical Affairs Committee of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. He is a member of the Catholic Biblical Association and the Canon Law Society of America.



Bobbie Hunt is the Immediate Past President of the National Council of Catholic Women. Mrs. Hunt is retired from the Davis County Health Department where she was an administrative assistant and office manager for 21 years. Recently she was given the honor of being named as a Dame of the Papal Order of St. Gregory the Great, which is the highest honor a lay woman can receive in the Catholic Church. Ms. Hunt has previously been awarded the Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice (for Church and Pope) medal.



Liz Schiavone is very active in the Diocese of Arlington, VA. She is also a full-time wife and mother of five grown children. Liz works part-time for an insurance company and volunteers at her parish. She attended Florida State University and the University of Alabama, where she graduated in 1979 as a retail management and marketing research major. Liz was raised Presbyterian but converted to Catholicism in 1993. She says the example of others led her deeper and deeper into the Faith, until she wanted nothing more than to live it herself. "We are called to serve," she said. "We are called to try to get to heaven and try to get each other into heaven."



Patty Bluemel has a BS from the University of Miami in Science, an MA from Bucknell University in Education and Science, and has studied Theocentric Psychology at LaSalle University in the doctorate program. She is the author of *The Last Crusader*, a novel about AIDS in Ethiopia, and the *Lalibela Effect*, a spiritual pilgrimage to the holy city of Lalibela, Ethiopia. Ms. Bluemel is a founder of WIAC, the Women's Institute and Center, an educational facility for women in Ethiopia. She is also the Founder of The Lalibela Foundation, an educational center for spiritual teachings. Patricia and her husband, who was a missionary physician, lived in Ethiopia for 12 years.
