Apply now for private school scholarships for military families



Get an average of \$7,000 a year for K-12 education

ST. PETERSBURG – Private school scholarships are now available to dependents of military veterans. Parents seeking new educational options for the 2022-23 school year can apply for the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship and the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options with just one application through Step Up For Students.

Dependent children of members of the United States Armed Forces may qualify, <u>regardless of household income</u>. This includes members of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, or Space Force and reservists. Scholarships average about \$7,000 and can be used to pay for K-12 private school tuition and fees. Families can apply by visiting <u>www.stepupforstudents.org</u>.

The Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (FTC), which began in 2002, and the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES-EO), created in 2019, provide learning options for students in grades K-12. Combined this year, they funded over 163,000 students in more than 2,000 private schools statewide.
